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#### Let's Build Canada Member Survey Results

#### Methodology

The following survey was conducted by Abacus Data on behalf of Let's Build Canada. The survey was conducted from August 12th to 28th 2021 with a sample of n=867 members of Let's Build Canada's affiliate unions, which represents approximately 200,000 individuals in the skilled trades.

Individuals were invited to complete the online survey via email invite from Abacus Data or their affiliate union.

In total, 1,210 members who were invited to complete the survey entered the survey. We are unable to determine how many were initially invited due to the mixed recruitment methodology. Of the 1,210 who started the survey, 867 or 71.6% completed it, 317 and 343 or 28.3% partially completed the survey. The survey was live from August 12th at 9am EST to August 28th at 11:59pm EST.

Only respondents who had completed the full set of questions were used in the analysis of data, all partial responses were removed in the data analysis. The data were not weighted.
